






Where are we in this pandemic?

Cases overall are on the rise again, *but* hospitals are better prepared/ stocked, able to manage volume, and know more about treating the Disease.

Vaccines are in development and likely to come out next year, but higher risk populations will be prioritized. It may be another year before a vaccine is available broadly. And there will be many who opt not to get it.



Rapid testing is also in the mix, but researchers are still refining accuracy/reliability, and both cost and supply are barriers.

Herd Immunity Researchers and medical professionals are still learning about the disease. For example transmission seems to come in clusters, rather than expanding at steady rate. And they are still researching how prior infection impacts future infection and transmission.



At best, we're about halfway through.

The Jazz Age

Expansion of American Literature

Harlem Renaissance

Surrealism and Art Deco Movements

1920s Social Dance Resurgence

- Shift away from complexity/study of ragtime era dancing
- New "modern" dances brought closer physical contact with partner
- Individual social dancing crossed into mainstream white culture



Reality Check:

It did not happen overnight.

People made it happen.

Are we finally going to talk about us?! Yes!





A Possible Path Forward

A Four-Phase Approach to Planning:

- 1. Social Distance Phase
- 2. Local Phase
- 3. Regional Phase
- 4. New Normal Phase

Social Distance Phase – emphasize online

Organizer Work

Community Culture

Core Values and Culture/Safety work

Preparing for excellent volunteer coordination

Fundraising

For freelancers

For your dance orgs -appeal letters or campaigns, social media campaign

Preparing for next phase:

- ☐ Plan for beginners, appropriate programming, and pathways for skill building
- ☐ Encourage local musicians NOW and create opportunities for them to connect and build repertoire
- ☐ Plan now for future marketing
 - > you'll need a critical mass of humans regardless of skill level
 - people will be looking, help them find you
- ☐ Engage your community about adjusting expectations and being a part of rebuilding



Local Phase – small and accessible

Organizer Work

Prepare, practically, mentally, and financially for smaller crowds

Expect fewer experienced dancers on the floor, more beginners

Focus on community building

Prioritize fun over complexity

Potlucks (with safety precautions)

Social media connections to new folks

Keep up online or distant engagement with those not yet ready to return

Preparing for next phase:

- ☐ Reach out to other arts orgs to find out how they are doing and explore joint events
- ☐ Create a regional marketing plan, either independent or in collaboration with others



Regional Phase - regional travel resuming

Organizer Work

Collaborate to set up mini-tours for regional freelancers

Incorporate skill-building in programming, establish it as a norm

Continue nurturing community

Collaborate to co-host events with other arts orgs

Market, market! (regionally and collaboratively)


