The Country Dancers of Rochester have held contra dances with live music every Thursday night since 1976 (except during the pandemic) and English country dances since the 1980s. It has also sponsored an annual dance weekend since 1980 and a Jane Austen Ball for the last 15 years. Cindy Culbert has been contra dancing since 2016 and English Country Dancing since 2018 and was elected President of CDR in 2020 during the pandemic. Rich Dempsey has been dancing contra since 1994, and has served several roles for CDR including previous treasurer and current webmaster and sound tech. cdrochester.org
